### FROM THE PASTOR

In John Bevere's book, "The Bait of Satan," he shares with the Christian community about the trap that Satan uses to destroy relationships. Now think about it, we are social beings and we live within a society where we have our identity. Outside of our social realm we have little, if no identity. So we are baited by Satan to struggle with that concept. How many of you have heard, "I have been hurt by that person, because of what they have said to me or said about me, or have totally ignored me?"

The word you and I are looking for is "Offense". Others have been *offensive*. Bevere says, "that offense itself is not deadly—if it stays in the trap. But if we pick it up and commend it and feed on it in our hearts, then we have become *offended*. Offended people produce much fruit, such as hurt, anger, outrage, jealousy, resentment, strife, bitterness, hatred, and envy. John Bevere says that some of the consequences of picking up an offense are insults, attacks, wounding, division, separation, broken relationships, betrayal, and backsliding (Bevere, p2)."

In this season of Lent we are to seek God's love, forgiveness, and we need to be in an attitude of repentance. I ask you this...have I been an *offense* to you? If so, I seek your forgiveness and ask you to return to the fellowship and relationship of the Church. If you have been an *offense*, you need to seek forgiveness and rejoin the fellowship of the Church. If you've seen where you have allowed Satan to trap you and steal your joy, you need to repent.

Jesus died on the Cross—for your sins and mine, and the only person I know who can reclaim the joy that He gives is YOU. --Tony
