Bell

From a 1980 historical pamphlet of the church, the brick masonry church building located on Stonewall Street was occupied in 1892 after a 5-year building program. It was described as "Gothic architecture with high vaulted slate roof, tall steeple and memorial art-glass windows." The bell is not mentioned but could have been placed in the steeple when it was built, since there is no mention of purchasing a bell elsewhere in the history.

Robye and J. T. Lindsey celebrated their 50th Wedding Anniversary on April 29, 2004 here. At that time we were talking about selling the old church building to Bethel College. Robye asked that in lieu of gifts that the people give to a bell fund to have the old bell moved. That was done. Since then the bell has been on the covered porch at the entryway to the Gathering Area. The problem has been in finding someone capable of refurbishing the bell. Mark Thompson has found a company in Memphis.

The family of Nellie Hamilton (Carolyn Patterson's aunt) wants to give something to the church in memory of Nellie and they are interested in a bell tower or some type of structure to house the old bell. They have given \$33,500.

In the session meeting, the question was asked whether a bell tower will be built when we build the sanctuary. The original architectural drawing does not include a bell tower, but we probably will not use the original architectural drawing for a new sanctuary. Also the question arose as to whether or not we would like to be able to "ring" the bell. The session is committed to having the bell refurbished, but would like your opinion as to how we display it. If we build a small structure to house it, and in the future we want to add it to a bell tower as part of the sanctuary, we can. If we build a 20-foot bell tower and restore all the mechanisms to be able to ring the bell, it would be most likely be permanent. Another suggestion was made that if we want a bell tower in the sanctuary when we do build, that we could buy a new bell for it or have electronic chimes.

The Patterson family wants to do this as a memorial for Nellie Hamilton, but if any money is left over when refurbishing the bell and displaying it is complete, it can be used for whatever the session deems necessary.

Some pictures will be placed on the bulletin board so you can get a general idea of what is involved.

On **July 8 at 6 pm** a presentation will be made by John Euchus, Bell Restoration Specialist from Gatlinburg, TN. Everyone interested is invited to attend.
