#### Touch the Future

Groups met in different rooms to choose the three most important areas (discussed in previous discernment sessions) for the ministry of our church. Evangelism is the Core Value that has come from this process with the following sub-categories: Prayer Warriors, Biblical Teaching, Visitation (Elderly), and Visitation (College). We will meet with the congregation to continue discerning God's missions for this church. We are planning an Elders Shepherd's Group dessert and coffee/tea on Monday evening at **7:00 p.m. on November 16<sup>th</sup>** with Rev. William Jones. Each elder will have his/her shepherd group meet together to share with one another ways to implement our findings from our discernment processes. The 2009 Loaves and Fishes Program will provide urgent seed money to assist in developing a Colombian based Foundation (Nehemiah Foundation). The foundation will seek international grants for ministries to combat global problems such as hunger, lack of education, displaced people, and inadequate health care. This requires the presence of an employee to administer the foundation and constantly initiate efforts to identify and maintain regular communication with available funding sources.

Jairo Lopez, a faithful member of Cauca Valley Presbytery, has been employed to direct the development of the foundation. Mr. Lopez has served as an elder of the Nueva Esperanza Church, has traveled widely across the denomination. He will be a tremendous asset in the development of a new strategy to assist those in need around the world.
