Springs and ...fewleftstanding...

I DETEST having bad vision. It is something that I have always questioned of God. Why can I not see perfectly, you know 20/20? People with bad vision know what I am talking about especially those who have worn glasses for a very long time. Glasses are both a blessing and a burden. The problem with glasses is that they are so heavy they slide off your face unless you have worn them so long you now have permanent dents in your nose! In addition to the cosmetics, glasses still only offer us a limited range of vision: we are always aware of the imperfection of our eyes by our bad peripheral vision and the frames of the glasses. Our perspective is never the same as having perfect vision.

I remember the terror I felt as a young teenager when I first realized my vision was bad. I would stare at the chalkboard for hours squinting or trying the old "hole in the paper" trick trying to make out a simple word. I would mistakenly walk up to people I thought I knew only to realize it was not them. I knew people would call me "four eyes" and other names. Regardless of the names and stigma it carried, I got the glasses. In the end, the benefits of the glasses far outweighed the strain and struggle of bad vision.

Christianity is very much the same way. Before coming to know the triune God, our vision is bad and blurry. We know that there is something beyond the reaches of our sight but we can never quite make it out. We may even hesitate before going to Church or learning about Christ because of the stigma being a Christian carries. When we put on the "spectacles" of Christianity, we are able to see God in an improved way, a way that offers life everlasting. What are the spectacles we look through you might ask? The Bible, the inspired and infallible word of God.

Yet, like glasses, we are never able to make out the full, perfect image of God and distractions constantly bombard us. Our eyes should be fixed on Jesus Christ. What I mean is that we should be radically committed to Christ in all areas of our life. Of course, we will not always succeed, but it is not about constant success, it is about a constant attempt! We should at least be straining our eyes every day to see him. A "strain" implies a tension brought about by polemic forces. We are constantly living in between the tension of Christ and the world, the spirit and the flesh. Could we not give Christ a little more attention? Try giving more of your time, money and labor to causes that benefit God. Have you ever put on the glasses of Christianity? Why not? Are you afraid of what others might say about you?

Are you focusing on the imperfect distractions and staring at the frames or the blurriness of your peripheral vision?

Have you taken the glasses off completely?

Mark 10:21 - Jesus looked at him and loved him. "One thing you lack," he said. "Go, sell everything you have and give to the poor, and you will have treasure in heaven. Then come, follow me."
