From the Pastor's Desk

This last week Mary Ann and I went to Boswell, Oklahoma, to share in a Revival at Pigeon Roost Cumberland Presbyterian Church, and in a seminar about, "Alcoholism and the Native American" particularly the people of the Choctaw Nation. Rev. Dr. Virginia Espinoza was our host and seminar director. There were several agencies of the Choctaw Nation who shared their particular expertise during the three-day program. It was a positive and informative seminar. I had the honor of being the keynote speaker in sharing information on "Adult Children of Alcoholics Syndromes." This intervention is to help Adult Children of Alcoholics look at their personality characteristics and show them ways to break the cycle of psychological and mental abuse that is prevalent in alcoholic families. If teachers, caregivers, parents, and clergy can see these traits in the children or adult children of alcoholics, they may be able to refer them to a helping agency for personal growth counseling. It is believed that adult children of alcoholics and children who live in an alcoholic family are 25 times more prone to become addicted to alcohol or drugs. It is important to start an educational process early in the lives of our children in hopes that they will not become victims of alcohol or drugs. --Tony

Trunk or Treat

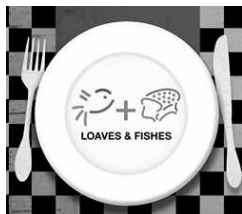
Fall Picnic

Each year the Cumberland Presbyterian Church has the opportunity to participate in the Loaves and Fishes Program during October & November. The 2011 Loaves and Fishes project will provide the necessary funding specifically for supporting hot lunch programs in both the Andes and Cauca Valley presbyteries in Colombia as well as Juarez, Mexico.

50% of the total offering is used for a hunger project outside the US; 25% of the total offering is used for the Missions Team denominational Hunger Fund and sent to the Missions Ministry Team; 25% of the total offering is retained by the congregation to meet community hunger needs.
